Spencer Street between Jeffcott Street and Lonsdale Street and La Trobe Street between King Street and Harbour Esplanade, Melbourne

About the project

Yarra Trams works with Public Transport Victoria (PTV) to carry out ongoing maintenance and renewal works across the network to ensure a safe and reliable tram network for future generations.

This section of tram track has been identified for urgent renewal.

Tram track renewal works will deliver improved ride, comfort and safety for our passengers and quieter infrastructure.

Motorists



Major works: Spencer Street between Jeffcott Street and Lonsdale Street and La Trobe Street between King Street and Harbour Esplanade will be closed to through traffic from 8pm Monday 5 April to 5am Monday 19 April 2021.

No vehicle access will be permitted during this time.

Pedestrians



The work zone will be fenced off for safety, however footpaths will remain open around the work area to allow pedestrian access to businesses and residences.

Please note that there will be kerb to kerb fencing which will limit pedestrian crossings. These fences are required to ensure public safety.

Crossing points will be facilitated where possible and may change depending on the construction activities taking place.

Noise and dust



Construction will take place 24-hours a day so that we can complete the works quickly and reduce the period of time that we inconvenience you. Noise and dust are unavoidable, however we will work to minimise this as much as possible and complete the noisiest works between 6am and 10pm.

Local access and parking



Major works: Access on Spencer Street between Jeffcott Street and Lonsdale Street and La Trobe Street between King Street and Harbour Esplanade will be unavailable from 8pm Monday 5 April to 5am Monday 19 April 2021.

Local access only will be available for properties on LaTrobe Street between Kings Street and 494 LaTrobe Street.

Residents are encouraged to park in surrounding streets prior to the works commencement date, noting local parking restrictions.

Parking and local access will be reinstated on completion of works.
