Works Notification

Tram Stop Upgrade

Toorak Road, South Yarra

April 2021

We're building a new accessible tram stop on Toorak Road as part of the South Yarra Station upgrade. We're also upgrading the tram power supply near the intersection of Toorak Road and Chapel Street.

Expect temporary road closures, local access changes, and detours for public transport and traffic along Toorak Road between Murphy and River streets and on Chapel Street between Toorak Road and Daly Street.

What to expect	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Night works. Mostly low levels of noise during the night with some short periods of medium-to-high levels when concrete is cut or excavating takes place. Local temporary lane, parking and footpath closures for short periods of time. Vehicles, trucks, small machinery and contractors on site. Some pedestrian detours in place as required. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 24-hour works. Toorak Road will be closed to traffic between Davis Avenue and Claremont Street from 10pm Friday 11 June to 5am Saturday 19 June 2021. Toorak Road will also be closed between Chapel Street and River Street from 1am Wednesday 16 June to 5am 18 June. Temporary changes to local streets. Some detours for public transport passengers, cyclists, and traffic. High levels of noise during the day and evening until 10pm e.g. concrete, asphalt and steel cutting. Medium levels of noise at night e.g. delivery of rail.

Early works

Platform works service investigations

Night works: 9pm to 6am, Thursday 15 to Friday 16 April and Thursday 29 April to Friday 30 April 2021

- Setting up work area including traffic management.
- Cutting holes in the concrete or asphalt in the footpath, road and tram way near the site of the new platforms.
- Excavating to locate underground services.
- Reinstating the work areas.

Pole installation work

Night works: early and late May (dates and times will be provided closer to the works)

- Setting up work area including traffic management.
- Cutting holes in the concrete or asphalt in the footpath.
- Excavating to locate underground services where new poles will go.
- Installation of new poles for the power supply upgrade.
- Reinstating the work areas.

Road and parking

- Temporary lane closures in Toorak Road and Chapel Street, but no roads will be closed.
- On-street car parking will be temporarily closed near work sites, as required.
- Traffic management and signage will direct traffic, please follow signage around works.

Public transport

No changes to trams on Toorak Road or Chapel Street.

Pedestrians

- There may be temporary footpath closures.
- Local detours may be in place, please follow signage around works.

Noise and dust


Medium-to-high level noise and low-to-medium level dust is expected.

Businesses located around the works area will remain open during the works. Please continue to support your local businesses during these essential infrastructure works. Pedestrian access to these businesses will remain open at all times.



Major works

Platform works

24-hour works: 10pm Friday 11 June to 5am Saturday 19 June 2021

Work will involve:

- Setting up work areas and traffic management.
- Building two new accessible tram platforms including associated infrastructure like new tram shelters, passenger information systems.
- Installing a bike lane and bike parking hoops outside South Yarra Station.
- Widening the pedestrian crossing and footpath.
- Creating water sensitive garden beds.
- Reinstating the area.

Power upgrade work – stage one

Night work: 11pm to 5am, Friday 11 June to Wednesday 18 June 2021

- Setting up work areas and traffic management.
- Trenching and installing power infrastructure (pits and conduits) within the tram tracks and roadway.
- Reinstating the area.

Power upgrade work – stage two

24-hour works: 1am Wednesday 16 June to 5am Friday 18 June 2021

- Setting up work area and traffic management.
- Trenching and installing power infrastructure within the tram tracks and roadway between Chapel Street and River Street.
- Reinstating the work areas.

Road and parking

- Toorak Road will be closed to traffic between Davis Avenue and Claremont Street from 10pm Friday 11 June to 5am Saturday 19 June 2021.
- Osborne Street will be closed at Toorak Road from 10pm Friday 11 June to 10pm Sunday 13 June.
- Toorak Road will also be closed to through traffic between Chapel Street and River Street from 1am Wednesday 16 June to 5am Friday 18 June.
- Other lane and on street car park closures will be required around work areas.
- Traffic management and signage will direct traffic, please follow signage around works.

Public transport

There will be service changes to tram Route 58. We recommend you allow extra time for your journey. For more information closer to the works, visit: yarratrams.com.au/servicechanges

Pedestrians

There may be temporary footpath closures around the works with local detours in place. Please follow signage around the works.

Noise and dust

Construction will occur 24-hours a day.

Noise and dust are unavoidable, but we will work to minimise this as much as possible and complete the noisiest works between 6am to 10pm. High levels of noise are expected during the first couple of days while the tracks are dug out and rubble removed. For the rest of the work there will be short periods of high-level noise.

Open for business

Businesses located around the works area will remain open during the works. Please continue to support your local businesses during these essential infrastructure works. Pedestrian access to these businesses will remain open at all times.

As this work is necessary to maintain a safe tram network as required by the *Rail Management Act 1996 (Vic)*, Yarra Trams will not compensate any third parties for any losses incurred during the project.

Close out works

Once the major works are complete, we will need to do some close out works. This work will include finishing works on the footpaths and garden beds.

Health and safety

To ensure the safety of all workers and the community, all construction and maintenance work undertaken by Department of Transport and its contractors are operating under High Risk COVID Safe plans.

About the project

These works are part of the South Yarra Station Upgrade and the introduction of E-Class trams on Route 58 in late 2021.

The South Yarra Station Upgrade will create a safer and more accessible space, with improvements to the station entrance area and amenities, a new canopy over the station entrance and an accessible tram stop on Toorak Road.

E-Class trams are larger than other trams on the network, with room for more than 200 passengers. On Route 58 we need to make changes at stops so E-Class trams can operate safely. This includes upgrades to the power supply system.
